Positive Disruption in Murton



Murton Neighbourhood Policing Team police have been working with partnership agencies to tackle some of the problems highlighted by the community which has raised concerns around anti-social behaviour, and traffic and drugs offences. The team have carried out a number of magistrate's search warrants and traffic operations. Over the course of one week, five people were arrested for drugs offences, burglary, criminal damage, and possession of an offensive weapon.

Neighbourhood E-BIKES



Murton Neighbourhood Policing Team have carried active patrols on the new Electric Pedal Cycles which are in partnership with the local councils. Officers have conducted Hi-Visibility intelligence gathering patrols as well as engaging with many members of the public and local residents. These activities will continue by the Murton Team.

Keep yourself safe this winter

As the days get shorter and the nights get darker, we're urging people to take steps to prevent themselves from becoming victims of crime.

Dark evenings can provide the perfect cover for criminals who can easily spot an open window, an unoccupied room, see valuables left on display in your car or try their luck with an unlocked door without being noticed.

But, by taking simple steps – like locking all your doors, even when you're at home – you can help prevent a criminal from targeting you and your property.

If you do notice anything suspicious, please report it to us. Either call us on 101, or dial 999 in an emergency.

Three simple steps to help protect your home

Leave a light on or use timer switches so lights come on when it gets dark; lock all windows and doors – even if you're at home, and don't leave your keys in the lock or on a side table, making it easy for a thief to fish them through your letterbox.

Further steps to protect your property

It's not just your home you should protect from thieves – ensure all your outbuildings and sheds are secure by installing a security light or CCTV.

Always remove all valuables from your vehicles when leaving them unattended, and make sure you've locked the door – it only takes a few seconds, but it could mean the difference between having your car stolen or having it there when you return.
