## **Jottings from the Parish Council**

- 1. The precept for 2022 / 2023 is £8,516 and Council Tax for Band D will be £42.50 which represents a 3.6% increase on 2021 / 2022/ The increase is due primarily the cost of the recent by-election.
- 2. The Annual Report is presented at the Annual Parish Meeting on March 21st it is also available on the website at www.hawthornparish.co.uk. It includes the draft unaudited accounts for 2021/2022.
- 3. The new solar powered noticeboards have now been installed. These are courtesy of the successful £8,600 grant.
- 4. The Parish Council continue to work with DCC to look at the issues around the speed limit on Stockton Road.
