#### **Nomination form**

- 1. Nomination forms will be invited in December of each year and should be completed and either handed or emailed to a Councillor or the Parish Clerk.
- 2. Forms are available in hard copy in the newsletter, via email from the clerk and online from the Parish Council website.
- 3. Anyone resident in the Hawthorn and over the age of 18 is eligible for nomination.
- 4. Parish Councillors and Parish Council employees are not eligible for nomination.
- 5. The closing date for entries is January 31st each year.
- 6. The name of the winner will be decided by the Parish Council and the award presented by the Chairman of the Parish Council at the Annual Parish Meeting in March.
- 7. The name of the winner will be recorded on the 'Roll of Winners' as a permanent and public record of the award.
- 8. All the nominees will be presented with a Norman Hughes Award certificate.
